WATER FACILITIES

Municipal ownership. Water from four driven wells - 10" x 100 ft. and 12 driven wells - 6" x 70 ft. by one Laidlaw-Dunn-Gordon Pump, capacity 388 gals. per min. and by one Knowles pump, capacity 520 gals. per minute to stand pipe, 12" x 10" - capacity 30,000 gals. 20 miles 10' to 4" cast iron mains laid 1886 and extended 1888 & 1892. 105 double hydrants. Domestic pressure, 45 lbs. Fire pressure up to 125 lbs. Average daily consumption in summer: 1,500,000 gals. - in winter: 1,000,000 gals.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Partly paid, four paid men and 25 volunteers. Five companies, two horses. One hose wagon with 1000' 2 1/2" C.R.I. hose and 40 gal chemical tank with 150' 1 1/2" chemical hose, four hand hose carts. One Wigan H & L Truck 1800 ft 2 1/2" rubber hose, 600 ft C.R.I. hose on hand hose carts. Fire alarm: electric 19 stations. Whistle on pumping station.

Grades level. Public lights electric. The following streets are paved with vitrified brick: 3 front from Wheeler to First, from Spycamore to Oak, Third St. from Kimball to Elm. Second St. from Spycamore to Wheeler. Least from Front to First St. Wheeler, Park & Spycamore from Front to Second Sts, making about one mile of paving.
